## BIG DREAMS AND HARD WORK!

After five years and a good deal of hard work, current Fellowcraft Gregg Senko and his good friend, business partner and fellow Freemason Justin Boros (Sarasota Lodge #147) will see the fruits of their labor finally take hold. Since late 2005, the duo has been working diligently on creating an Irish dance production for the masses. The pair was initially inspired by Michael Flatley's *Lord of the Dance*. After seeing the show in the late 90s, Boros worked in his basement on the Celtic art form, teaching himself, and eventually toured with *Lord of the Dance* from 1999 to 2002. Senko interviewed Flatley in 1997 for a local paper and was so inspired that he sought out a teacher the next day. In 2004, he was approached by Flatley's Las Vegas troupe to join the show.

While *Lord of the Dance* has been one of the most successful touring productions of all time in any genre, becoming part of someone else's show just wasn't quite enough for the pair. They were determined to make their own show, and make their own they did. After a long process, they came up with *Rhythm in the Night*. Starting out with a full-fledged business plan and following up with copyrighting of their material, the pair sought investors, though it always turned out to be a catch-22. Investors wanted to see an example of the show on video. The pair didn't have the money to assemble a troupe, let alone a stage, lighting rig, composer, etc. Without funding, they had nothing to show. Without anything to show, they'd get no funding.

Thanks to one Paul Duffy of the Irish Rover Pub in Sarasota, Florida, the production will finally come to fruition this November 13th in Sarasota. "It's going to be the equivalent of when a TV show has a pilot episode," said Br. Senko. "Now we'll finally have something to show potential investors. A show like *Lord of the Dance* has sold more tickets in 15 years than the Rolling Stones have in 40. There's no reason why anyone looking to invest in entertainment would pass us up." Portraying a traditional tale of good versus evil, the show will feature the talents of a few Irish folk tunes, a violinist and a bagpiper. Not only that, but *Rhythm in the Night* will open for ACDC front man Brian Johnson when the show takes the stage this November. It may not be your typical combination (Irish dance and rock 'n roll), but you can bet both Boros and Senko are amped to finally see their dream take form.

(Editor's note: This *just goes to show you*, Brethren, that with hard work and determination, big dreams can come to life! Best wishes for success, Brothers Senko and Boros! Break a leg ... or two! And may God Bless! LAD.)

## THE WARDENS

In every Symbolic Lodge, there are three principal officers, namely, a Master, a Senior Warden and a Junior Warden. This rule has existed over many years and is so universal that it has been considered as one of the landmarks. It exists in every country and in every Rite. The titles of the officers may be different in different languages, but their functions as presiding over the Lodge in a three party division of duties, are everywhere the same.

In the various Rites, the positions of these officers vary, but, in all, the triangular position of the three officers relative to each other is preserved, for a triangle being formed within the square of the Lodge, the Master and Wardens will each occupy one of the three points.

The Senior Warden is the second officer in a Symbolic Lodge, and assists the Worshipful Master in the government of the Craft during the hours of labor. In the absence of the Master, he presides over the Lodge, appointing another Brother, not necessarily the Junior Warden, to occupy his place in the West. His jewel is the level, a symbol of the equality which exists among the Craft while at labor in the Lodge. His seat is in the West, and he represents the column of Strength.

The Junior Warden is the third officer in a Symbolic Lodge. He presides over the Craft during the hours of refreshment, and, in the absence of the Master and Senior Warden, he performs the duty of presiding officer. Hence, if the Master and Senior Warden were to die or be removed from the Jurisdiction, the Junior Warden would assume the chair for the remainder of the term.

The jewel of the Junior Warden is a Plumb, emblematic of the rectitude of conduct which should distinguish the Brethren when, during the hours of refreshment, they are beyond the precincts of the Lodge. His seat is in the South, and he represents the Pillar of Beauty.

## THE DEACONS

In every Symbolic Lodge, there are two officers who are called Deacons. It is to the Deacons that the introduction of visitors should be properly entrusted. Their duties comprehend, also, a general surveillance over the security of the Lodge, and they are the proxies of the officers by whom they are appointed. Hence their jewel, in allusion to the necessity of circumspection and justice is a square and compasses. In the center, the Senior Deacon wears a sun, which is distinguished by the presence of the East or rising sun, and the Junior Deacon a moon, which is distinguished by the presence of the West or setting sun.

The office of Deacons in Freemasonry appears to have been derived from the usages of the primitive church. In the Greek Church, the Deacons were always the doorkeepers. The Head Deacon was ordered to stand at the Men's door, and the Subdeacon, as he was called at that time, stood at the women's door, to see that none came in or went out during the oblation.

In the earliest rituals of the eighteenth century, there is no mention of Deacons, and the duties of those officers were discharged partly by the Jr. Warden and partly by the Sr. and Jr. Entered Apprentices, and they were not generally adopted in England until the union of 1812.
